June 28[™], 2022 MEETING MINUTES

Club President Mike/KE0ESG brought the meeting to order at 7:04 pm at the Bismarck State College Career Academy.

A. Approval of May 2022 Minutes: Motion by Bob/N0TC, second by Mark/N0FAZ to approve the May 2022 meeting minutes; motion carried.

B. Treasurer's Report: Dee/KB0CGK gave a detailed update of expenses and income since the last report. The checking account balance as of this meeting is \$1,953.10; the savings account balance as of this meeting is \$9,840.29. Motion by George/W0GX, second by Kay/N0NWY to accept the report; motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

1. Technical: We received the Duplexer from Rich/WB0TML. Mike/KE0ESG stated that he did a preliminary tune up on the duplexer. Needs to be checked by someone from technical committee.

Mike/KE0ESG reported on HF antenna at Burleigh County Emergency Management EOC. When Mike/KE0ESG went to extend antenna, would not extend due to damage. It was either damaged before or during installation.

Removed from roof mount and brought to Mary Senger's attention of damage. Last item from EOC is that there is an Ameritron amplifier (AL-80) at site. It is not needed there for normal operations. Motion to remove it from EOC made by Bob/N0TC, seconded by George/W0GX. Motion passes.

2. Skywarn: Mark/N0FAZ and Mike/KE0ESG went to NWS and checked out radios and inspected antennas from ground. Everything checked out ok. Need procedures for the tuner. We are allowed in the building now and can go to NWS if activated.

Club President Mike/KE0ESG is looking for someone to take over as the Club Skywarn coordinator. If anyone is interested, please contact him or one of the Club officers.

3. VE Testing: Bob/N0TC reported that the new Technician tests, as of July 1, the new tests are to be used. He also discussed what FCC fees are required for upgrade, address changes, new licenses. Also discussed was the renewal of VE credentials.

4. Net Control: Mike/KE0ESG gave report on Net Control on weekly check-ins. There are currently 5 Net Controllers and stated we could use a few more. (See NoiseLetter for details on check in numbers)

Old Business

1. Lewis and Clark on the Trail report. Mike/KE0ESG reported that we had three club members activate for the event, George/W0GX, Kay/N0NWY, and Mike/KE0ESG. The club had 1522 contacts with 147.13 hours of operation. Kay/N0NWY was given the Trail Blazer award for most FT-8 QSO'S. All Three were given Certificates of Recognition for participating. CDARC place 6th in overall contacts made. Minot K0AJW placed 1st in the event with 3134 contacts made. As the State of North Dakota, we place 1st in event for number of contacts. CDARC as a club made contacts with nine states.

3. Field Day report: Trailers were moved to location on Friday morning by Bob/NOTC and Mike/KE0ESG. Setup began around 9am on Saturday. Mike/KE0ESG brought his mobile tower to site on Saturday morning. The G5RV antenna was used instead of the Mosely beam due to the high winds during setup and predicted for the entire weekend. Antenna

was able to tune up on all bands with FT-1000 except upper 80 meter band. A manual tuner was setup for those frequencies. Mike/KE0ESG brought his FT-991a and computer setup for Digital modes. We began operation at 1pm on Saturday. We made 423 contacts on several bands and modes. 312 SSB, 112 FT8. We contacted all 50 states, missed 3 for complete sweep of all districts. Missed Virgin Island, Manitoba, and Newfoundland. 12 operators during event. 21.5 hours of operation, averaging 19.67 contacts per hour or 1 contact for every 3 minutes of operation. Lorne/NOCYK provided movie "LOVE AND MONSTERS". Teardown was completed around 2pm. Chad/KC0AFB, Bob/N0TC and Mike/KE0ESG returned trailers to impound lot.

4. Club Picnic: August 23rd, 2022, Missouri Slope Model Aero Club facility at the McDowell Dam Recreation Area. More to come in meeting in July.

5. Jamboree on the Air. October 15th Setup at 9am at Tom O'leary warming house. Mike/KE0ESG will bring his mobile tower. We should not need to bring trailers to event as we can use a dipole for the event. Equipment will be inside the building for JOTA. Will be there until around 3pm. We should do some promotion of the event.

6. Workshops or Projects at BSC: This is for the Fall of 2022 or early spring 2023. Dipole was suggested as a workshop. Balun construction was also suggested. We could have a demonstration of different modes of operations. Demonstrations also could be on different software to use. 12 operators during event. 21.5 hours of operation, averaging 19.67 contacts per hour or 1 contact for every 3 minutes of operation. (Note: if you already have a license, you already have a FRN; <u>you do not need to register again</u>)

VOLUNTEER EXAMINERS TAKE NOTE!

All ARRL-accredited Volunteer Examiners (VE's) must participate in at least one testing session every 5 years for their credentials to remain valid.
